Dear Association Members,

"Twenty, Twenty" is here. It's kinda fun to and easy to say, isn't it? -- "Twenty, Twenty." I believe Twenty, twenty is going to be a great year for our Association. We will continue the missions and ministries we have been doing and I hope we will see some new missions developing. One in particular that I am very excited about is the possibility of having an Impact Mission Camp HERE, in our area in 2021. We have much to do in order to accomplish this, but the BGAV has agreed for us to pursue this opportunity. The Mission/Evangelism Committee will form a sub-committee to work on this mission project.

We have two "3-Circles" evangelism training seminars already scheduled for 2020. Our hope is for 80% of our membership to be trained within the next two years. In 2019, we had four regional training seminars and three specific training seminars.

- --Liberty: 12 people trained

- --First Baptist Church, South Hill: 10 people trained
- --The Jamaica Mission Team: 10 people trained Eighty people were trained to use the "3-Circles" evangelism method. Plan to attend a "3-Circles" training this year!

- --Sunday, March 8 -- 2:30PM to 4:30PM at Antioch Baptist Church.
- --Wednesday March 18 -- 7:00PM to 8:30PM at Mount Horeb Baptist Church. Dinner will be served at 6:15PM At least two additional regional trainings will be scheduled in 2020. Also, if your church would like to have a specific training, this can be scheduled, also.
