Dear Association Members,

I pray this edition of the Grapevine finds you and yours well. While I do not have official numbers, it appears COVID cases in our area, are down from what they have been. Many people within our Association have been vaccinated and many more will be in the near future. I have heard the availability of the vaccine is such that the age for those who can receive the vaccination has been lowered.

Many of our churches have moved services back inside and some are having services both inside and outside via short range FM transmitters. A few or our churches have opened up Sunday School and other in-person ministries and Bible studies. Although church-life seems to be moving toward "normal," to my knowledge social distancing and the use of masks suggestions/requirements have not changed for indoor

gatherings. I encourage you to "be safe"--continue to follow the appropriate guidelines when gathering. Be Safe!

We are planning to open Camp Concord this summer! I am so excited to see this ministry will be operational this year. Camp director, Wanda Williamson, is working closely with the Mecklenburg health department to insure the camps are run as safely as possible this summer. The number of children and students attending camp will be less than normal. Also, the camping weeks will be shortened. These schedule changes along with other steps and changes to the normal camp routine will help us to have "safe" camping weeks. We have heard a few concerns about opening the camp, but the Camp board and I feel very good about the precautions that will be put in place to make the camping weeks as safe as possible. Again, the health department is working with us and we have observed the measures other camps have taken or are going to use to run their camps. 
