Accommodations: Campers sleep in screened cabins on bunk beds. Other facilities include, dining hall, multipurpose building, craft cabin, outdoor chapel, recreation field, beach area, picnic shelter, and campfire ring. Facilities are used for classes, Bible study, meals, worship, games, etc.

Camper Mail: Many of our campers look forward to *Mail Call* each day. Parents, family and friends are encouraged to send mail to campers. Please send mail a few days before the camp week begins to insure delivery.

Visitors: For the safety of our campers, visitors are not permitted during camp sessions. A tour of the camp may be given during camp sessions only by making prior arrangements with the Camp Manager.

Parents wishing to provide birthday cakes or other desserts may make arrangements with the Food Coordinator.

Driving: Because of limited parking space, we ask that campers be brought to camp. Please make prior arrangements with Camp Manager if a camper will be driving. Car keys

must be turned-in at check-in.

Registration: Send completed Registration-Medical Form and \$25 non-refundable deposit to Camp Concord, Box 99 State Line Road, Clarksville, VA 23927. Make check payable to State Line Baptist Assembly, Inc. The deposit fee is credited toward the total camp fee. (Note: non-refundable camp fee of \$10.00 for the Day Camp is due with the registration form) Balances are due in full by deadlines. Please register early; camps are filled on a first come, first served basis. Confirmation notice will be sent upon receipt of registration unless form is received within two weeks of camp.

Cancellation: The camper fee (less the non-refundable deposit) is refundable if the request is received in writing 14 days prior to camp start date. Contact the Concord Baptist Association Office.

Camperships: It is our desire that every child wanting to attend Camp Concord be able to do so. Camperships are available to those who otherwise would not be able to attend because of financial burdens.

Note: Camperships are available for one week per season per child. For campership application, contact Concord Baptist Association.

Check-in: Stop at the camp office to check-in before going to the camp area. Check-in begins at 9:00 AM for Day Camp. Check-in begins at 4:00 PM on Friday, June 30th for 2/3 Grade Overnight. Check-in for all other camps begins on Sunday at 4:00 PM. Campers will be sent a designated time to arrive.

Camp Store: Camp store will be open during designated hours. Campers may bring up to \$10.00 to spend in the store. For security we ask that money be turned in to the camp office at check-in. Put the money in an envelope and print the child's name and amount of money on the envelope.
